Master Naturalists are required to do 8 hours of advanced training and 40 volunteer hours each year. Note: You may include travel time incurred in excess of 30 minutes to and from volunteer assignments.

Approved activities include (but are not limited to):

- 1. **Educational activities:** Classes, workshops, presentations, demonstrations (including preparing and developing materials); phone consultations, posters, displays, articles, research, interpretive walks, guided tours, site visits, technical assistance to community groups, etc.
- 2. **Stewardship Activities**: Hands-on activities to improve habitat & other natural resources (invasive plant removal, habitat restoration, trail building)
- 3. Citizen Science Activities: Data collection, monitoring, biological inventories, other research-oriented activities (bird censuses, frog watch)
- 4. Special Events, Information Booths
- 5. **Support/Management Activities (that benefit the public):** planning programs and activities, for the public, outreach, publicity, set-up and clean-up, grant writing, evaluation
- 6. **Internal Administration of Master Naturalist Program:** Administrative work that directly benefits the MN program itself. For example: screening applicants, organizing training, mentoring, hosting, communications (newsletter, website, phone tree), fundraising, public relations/marketing, advocacy, committee work, record-keeping, writing reports, volunteer recognition.
- 7. Off-site volunteer service
